Gifts of the Holy Ghost

Wisdom – Recognizing the emptiness of earthly things we regard God and spiritual things as the highest good.

Understanding – Recognizing the true Catholic teaching and detecting false doctrines.

Counsel - helps us to discover the will of God under difficult circumstances.

Fortitude – strengthens us under trial to do God's will

Knowledge – enables us to grasp the teaching of the Church, to know God and Jesus Christ Whom He sent.

Piety – we love God as our Father, ever striving to do His will.

Fear of the Lord – makes us dread sin as the greatest of all evils, and enables us to quell fear of man and human respect.

Feast of the Most Holy Trinity

On the day of Pentecost the holy apostles received, as we have seen, the grace of the Holy Ghost. In accordance with the injunction of their divine Master, they will soon start on their mission of teaching all nations, and baptizing men in the name of the holy Trinity. It was but right, then, that the solemnity which is intended honour the mystery of one God in three Persons should immediately follow that Pentecost, with which it has a mysterious connection. Every homage paid to God by the Church's liturgy has the holy Trinity as its object. Time, as well as eternity, belongs to the Trinity. The Trinity is the scope of all religion. Every day, every hour belongs to It. The very essence of the Christian faith consists in the knowledge and adoration of one God in three Persons. This is the mystery whence all other flow. Our faith centers in this as in the master-truth of all it knows in this life, and as the infinite object whose vision is to form our eternal

happiness and yet, we know it only because it has pleased God to reveal Himself thus to our lowly intelligence, which, after all, can never fathom the infinite perfections of that God, who necessarily inhabiteth light inaccessible. It was God's good-pleasure to make known to us His essence, in order to bring us into closer union with Himself, and to prepare us, in some way for that face-to-face vision of Himself which He intends to give us in eternity. But His revelation is gradual: He takes mankind from brightness unto brightness, fitting it for the full knowledge and adoration of Unity in Trinity, and Trinity in Unity. The mystery of the Trinity has become to us, not only a dogma made known to our mind by revelation, but, moreover, a practical truth given to us by the unheard-of munificence of the three divine Persons: the Father, who has adopted us, the Son, whose brethren and joint-heirs we are, and the Holy Ghost, who governs us and dwells within us.

Dress Code

Welcome! Out of respect for the True Presence of Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, and for the edification of our neighbor, we kindly request that all who come to our parish observe the basic traditional Catholic standards of dress for church attendance:

 -Women and girls must cover their heads.
 -Women and girls must wear dresses or skirts that cover the knee completely when standing or sitting. Slacks, shorts, sleeveless, tight or low-cut clothing, and dresses or skirts with long slits above the knees are not permitted.

-It is recommended for men and boys to wear suit coats and ties for Sunday Mass. Jeans and other casual attire are inappropriate for attendance at church.
