Month of the Poor Souls

November is dedicated to the Souls in Purgatory. To the faithful who in the month of November assist the Souls in Purgatory with prayers or other pious exercises the following indulgences are granted: an indulgence of three years once each day of the month; a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions if they perform the same work every day for the entire month.

"To the faithful who during the octave of the Commemoration of All Souls visit a cemetery with piety and devotion and say either an oral or mental prayer for the departed a plenary indulgence applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory is granted under the usual conditions; this indulgence may be gained once each day during the octave. On any other day in the year an indulgence of seven years may be gained once a day for the same visit and prayer; the indulgence is applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory." *Matters Liturgical*

The children of light, who would live up to their dignity, must behave exactly as did the early Christians. As their only care is, to make their manner of life worthy of the Gospel of Christ, they go on, with all the simplicity of children of God, faithfully fulfilling the duties of their state of life, in the midst of a wicked and perverse generation, as stars of the firmament shine in the night. "As the stars," says St. Augustine, "keep on their

course in the track marked out for them by God, and grow not tired of sending forth their light in the midst of darkness, neither heed they the calamities which may be happening on earth; so should do those holy ones whose conversation is truly in heaven; they should pay no more attention to what is said or done against them, than the stars do."

The diminution of truth is evidently to be a leading peril of the latter times; for the Church is continually urging us to a sound and solid understanding of truth, as though she considered that to be the great preservative for her children. Previously, she gave them, as defensive armor, the shield of faith, and, as an offensive weapon, the word of God; circumspection of mind and intelligence she recommended to them, with a view to their preserving, during the approaching evil days, the holiness which is founded on truth. Today, she implored of them to be ever progressing in knowledge and all understanding, as being the essential means for abounding in charity, and for having the work of their sanctification perfected for the day of Christ Jesus.

Dress Code

Welcome! Out of respect for the True Presence of Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, and for the edification of our neighbor, we kindly request that all who come to our parish observe the basic traditional Catholic standards of dress for church attendance:

- Women and girls must cover their heads.
- Women and girls must wear dresses or skirts that cover the knee completely when standing or sitting. Slacks, shorts, sleeveless, tight or low-cut clothing, and dresses or skirts with long slits above the knees are not permitted.
- It is recommended for men and boys to wear suit coats and ties for Sunday Mass. Jeans and other casual attire are inappropriate for attendance at church.
