Mass Intention

Pro Populo

Father is current accepting Mass intentions for March. Customary offering is \$25 per Mass.

Paschaltide

We give the name Paschal Time to the period between Easter Sunday and the Saturday following Whit Sunday. It is the most sacred portion of the liturgical year and the one towards which the whole cycle converges. We shall understand how this is, if we reflect upon the greatness of Easter, which is called the feast of feasts, and the solemnity of solemnities, in the same manner, says St. Gregory, as the most sacred part of the Temple was called the Holy of holies; and the book of sacred scripture, wherein are described the espousals between Christ and the Church, is called the Canticle of Canticles. It is on this day that the mission of the Word Incarnate attains the object towards which it has hitherto been tending: man is raised up from his fall and regains what he had lost by Adam's sin.

May Crowning

The mission has purchased a statue of Our Lady which will be installed and blessed after Mass today. There will be a May crowning ceremony after Mass on May 13th. Please plan to stay after Mass for the crowning.

Regina Coeli

During Paschaltide the Regina Coeli replaces the Angelus, which is prayed daily at noon and 6 PM.

Queen of Heaven, rejoice. Alleluia For He Whom that was made worthy to bear. Alleluia Hath risen as He said. Alleluia Pray for us to God. Alleluia V: Rejoice and be glad, O Virgin Mary. Alleluia

R: For the Lord hath risen indeed. Alleluia Let us pray. O God, Who through the resurrection of Thy Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, hast vouchsafed to make glad the whole world, grant us, we beseech Thee, that, through the intercession of the Virgin Mary, His Mother, we may obtain the joys of eternal life. Through the same Christ Our Lord. Amen.

Total Consecration

For those who decided to make or renew the Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary according the method of St. Louis de Monfort, the books will be available after Mass on April 29th. The mission ordered two extra books in case there is anyone who did not originally respond, but would still like to make the consecration.

Easter Duty

We remind the faithful of their responsibility to receive Holy Communion during the Easter Time. This minimal duty is a mark of one's devotion to his Catholic Faith and is a serious obligation, binding under pain of mortal sin. The Easter Time in the United States begins on the First Sunday of Lent and concludes with Trinity Sunday, June 4.

Dress Code

Welcome! Out of respect for the True Presence of Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, and for the edification of our neighbor, we kindly request that all who come to our parish observe the basic traditional Catholic standards of dress for church attendance:

-Women and girls must cover their heads.
-Women and girls must wear dresses or skirts that
cover the knee completely when standing or
sitting. Slacks, shorts, sleeveless, tight or low-cut
clothing, and dresses or skirts with long slits above
the knees are not permitted.

-It is recommended for men and boys to wear suit coats and ties for Sunday Mass. Jeans and other casual attire are inappropriate for attendance at church.
