St. Martin

When he was still a soldier a poor man one day asked of him an alms, whereupon St. Martin offered him the half of his cloak which he cut in two portions with his sword. Engaged in the service of God he continued his military calling in a more noble way, combating for Him with all the strength and greatness of his soul. Wishing to remove from his own hands all traces of idolatry he braved the wrath of the pagans, and heaven confirmed his zeal by miracles. The union of monastic austerities with the ministry of souls did not appear to him to be an impossibility but a perfection, and a most fruitful alliance. In the Episcopate he did not hesitate to remain faithful to his rude covering and his cell cut in the rock. His progress in contemplation was such that he was enabled to read the supernatural world so well that he could discern the hostile actions of the demons, the evil genius characteristic of each of them and the title under which several had been worshiped by idolaters as Jupiter and Mercury. Before expiring her cried out: "Lord, if I am still necessary to Thy people I do not refuse to labor. But Thy will be done!"

MY Jesus, by thy most holy body stretched on the Cross, by thy most holy hands and feet pierced with hard nails, by thy most cruel death,

O HOLY souls, tormented in most cruel pains, as one truly devoted to you, I promise never to forget you, and continually to pray to the Most High for your release. I beseech you to respond to this offering which I make to you, and obtain for me from God, with whom you are so powerful on behalf of the living, that I may be freed from all dangers of soul and body; I beg both for myself and for my relations and benefactors, friends and enemies, pardon for our sins, and the grace of perseverance in good, whereby we may save our souls. Set us free from all misfortunes, miseries, sicknesses, trials and labours. Obtain for us peace of heart; assist us in all our actions; succour us promptly in all our spiritual and temporal needs; console and defend us in our dangers. Pray for the supreme Pontiff, for the exaltation of holy Church, for peace between nations, for Christian princes, and for tranquility among peoples; and obtain that we may one day all rejoice together in Paradise. Welcome! Out of respect for the True Presence of Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, and for the edification of our neighbor, we kindly request that all who come to our parish observe the basic traditional Catholic standards of dress for church attendance:

-Women and girls must cover their heads.
-Women and girls must wear dresses or skirts that cover the knee completely when standing or sitting. Slacks, shorts, sleeveless, tight or low-cut clothing, and dresses or skirts with long slits above the knees are not permitted.
